

SUNSTREE.



Size

Sized for X-Small.

Finished Measurements

- To fit bust 34-36in/86-96cm.
- Width (underarm) 42in/106cm.
- Length 29¹/₂in/75cm.
- Sleeve seam 161/2in/42cm.

Materials

- 3 x 200g balls of Noro *Ito* in #03.
- One pair size US 10/6mm needles.
- One pair size US 10½/6.5mm needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE.
- 4 buttons.

Note: For best results, the editor recommends using LYKKE[®] needles and hooks.

Gauge

15 sts and 23 rows to 4in/10cm over Stockinette stitch using size US $10\frac{1}{2}/6.5mm$ needles.

Knitting Abbreviations

Crochet Abbreviations

BP back post; **BPdc** back post double crochet; **BPsc** back post single crochet; **BPtr** back post treble crochet; **ch** chain(s); **ch**- refers to chain or space previously made (i.e., ch-1 space); **ch-sp** chain space previously made; **dc** double crochet (UK: tr=treble); **dc2tog** double crochet 2 stitches together; **dtr** double treble (UK: trt=triple treble); **FP** front post; **FPdc** front post double crochet; **FPsc** front post single crochet; **FPtr** front post treble crochet; **grp(s)** group(s); **hdc** half double crochet (UK: htr=half treble); **lp(s)** loop(s); **sc** single crochet (UK: dc=double crochet); **sc2tog** single crochet 2 stitches together; **sk** skip(ped); **sl** st slip stitch (UK: sc=single crochet); **sp(s)** space(s); **t-ch** turning chain; **tr** treble (UK: dtr=double treble); **trtr** triple treble (UK: qtr=quadruple treble).

Glossary

bind off To finish off an edge and keep stitches from unraveling by lifting the first stitch over the second, the second over the third, etc. (UK: cast off).

bind off in ribbing Maintain the rib pattern as you bind off (knit the knit stitches; purl the purl stitches) (UK: cast off in ribbing)

cast on Form a foundation row by making specified number of loops on the knitting needle. **decrease** Reduce the number of stitches in a row (i.e., knit 2 together; purl 2 together). **increase** Add to the number of stitches in a row (i.e., knit in front and back of stitch). **knitwise** Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to knit it.

make one Insert tip of LH needle from front to back under the strand between the last stitch worked and the next stitch on the needle. Knit into the back loop to increase one stitch.

make one purl stitch With the needle tip, lift the strand between the last stitch worked and the next stitch on left-hand needle and purl it. One purl stitch has been added.

no stitch On some charts, "no stitch" is indicated with shaded spaces where stitches have been decreased or not yet made. In such cases, work the stitches of the chart, skipping over the "no stitch" spaces. **place markers** Loop a piece of contrasting yarn or a purchased stitch marker onto the needle.

pick up and knit/purl Knit (or purl) into the loops along an edge.

purlwise Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to purl it.

selvage stitch Edge stitch that helps make seaming easier.

skip Skip specified number of stitches of the previous row and work into next stitch (UK: miss).
slip, slip, knit/purl Slip next two sts knitwise (purlwise), one at a time, to right-hand needle.
Insert tip of left-hand needle into fronts of these sts from left to right and knit/purl them together to decrease one stitch.

slip stitch In knitting, pass a stitch from the left-hand to the right-hand needle as if to purl without working it. In crochet, insert hook through loop or edge, yarn over and pull through loop on hook (UK: ss or sc).

work even Continue in specified pattern without increasing or decreasing (UK: work straight). yarn over In knitting, make a new stitch by placing the yarn over the right-hand needle (UK: yfwd, yon, yrn). In crochet, wind yarn around hook. (UK: yoh or yrh).

Back

With US 10½/6.5mm needles cast on 90 sts and work as foll: **Row 1 (RS)** K2, * P2, K2, rep from * to end.

Row 2 K all K sts and P all P sts to end.

Rep the last 2 rows for a further 4 rows.

Row 7 K2, * P2, K2tog, yfrn, rep from * to the last 4 sts, P2, K2.

Row 8 P2, * K2, P2, rep from * to end.

Row 9 K2, *P2, yfrn, K2tog, rep from * to the last 4 sts, P2, K2. Row 10 P2, * K2, P2, rep from * to end.

Rep rows 7 to 10 once more.

Rep rows 1 and 2 for 6 rows inc 4 sts evenly along the last row. 94 sts. (20 rows worked)

Work in St st as foll:

Row 1 (RS) Knit to end.

Row 2 Purl to end.

Rep the last 2 rows for a further 10 rows.

Row 13 K21, M1K, knit to the last 21 sts, M1K, K21.

Row 14 Purl to end.

Row 15 K31, M1K, knit to the last 31 sts, M1K, K31.

Row 16 Purl to end.

Row 17 Knit to end.

Row 18 Purl to end.

Rep the last 2 rows once more.

Row 21 K32, M1K, knit to the last 32 sts, M1K, K32.

Row 22 Purl to end.

Row 23 K22, M1K, knit to the last 22 sts, M1K, K22.

Row 24 Purl to end.

Rep rows 1 and 2 four times more.



32 Sweater

Row 33 K23, M1K, knit to the last 23 sts, M1K, K23. Row 34 Purl to end. Row 35 K35, M1K, knit to the last 35 sts, M1K, K35.

Row 36 Purl to end. Rep rows 1 and 2 three times more.

Row 43 K24, M1K, knit to the last 24 sts, M1K, K24.

Row 44 Purl to end. 108 sts.

Cont in St st AT THE SAME TIME dec 1 st at each end of the next row and every foll 4th row until 78 sts rem. Work 3 rows straight.

Armhole shaping

Cast off 4 sts at the beg of the next 2 rows. Then dec 1 st at each end of the foll 8 rows. 54 sts rem. Work straight for 34 rows.

Shoulders and back neck shaping

Row 1 Cast off 4 sts, knit until 10 sts on right hand needle, turn and put rem sts on a spare needle.

Row 2 Cast off 2 sts and purl to end.

Row 3 Cast off 3 sts and knit to end.

Row 4 As row 2.

Cast off rem 3 sts.

Return to the sts on the spare needle. Slip the center 26 sts onto a st holder.

With RS facing rejoin yarn to rem 14 sts and work as foll:

Row 1 Cast off 2 sts and knit to end.

Row 2 Cast off 4 sts and purl to end.

Row 3 Cast off 2 sts and knit to end.

Row 4 Cast off 3 sts and purl to end.

Row 5 Knit to end.

Cast off rem 3 sts.

Front

Work as given for back until front is 14 rows shorter than back.

Front neck shaping

K18 sts and put rem sts on a spare needle. Turn P2tog and purl to end. Cont to dec 1 st neck edge on the next 7 rows. 10 sts rem. Work one row.

Shoulder shaping

Row 1 Cast off 4 sts and knit to end.
Row 2 Purl to end.
Row 3 Cast off 3 sts and knit to end.
Row 4 Purl to end.
Cast off rem 3 sts.

Return to the sts on the spare needle. Slip the center 18 sts onto a st holder.

With RS facing rejoin yarn to the rem 18 sts and work as foll: Dec 1 st at neck edge on the next 8 rows. Work 3 rows straight.

Shoulder shaping

Row 1 (WS) Cast off 4 sts and purl to end.

Row 2 Knit to end. Row 3 Cast off 3 sts and purl to end.

Row 4 Knit to end.

Cast off rem 3 sts.

Sleeves

With US 10½/6.5mm needles cast on 34 sts and work as foll:
Row 1 (RS) K2, * P2, K2, rep from * to end.
Row 2 K all K sts and P all P sts to end.
Rep the last 2 rows for a further 4 rows.
Row 7 K2, * P2, K2tog, yfrn, rep from * to the last 4 sts, P2, K2.
Row 8 P2, * K2, P2, rep from * to end.
Row 9 K2, * P2, yfrn, K2tog, rep from * to the last 4 sts, P2, K2.
Row 10 P2, * K2, P2, rep from * to end.
Rep rows 7 to 10 once more.
Rep rows 1 and 2 for 6 rows. (20 rows worked)
Work in St st as foll:
Row 1 (RS) Knit to end.

Row 2 Purl to end.

Rep the last 2 rows AT THE SAME TIME inc 1 st at each end of the next row and every foll 8th row until 54 sts on the needle. Work straight until sleeve measures 16½in/42cm from beg ending with a wrong side row.

Shape top

Cast off 3 sts at the beg of the next 2 rows. Cast off 2 sts at the beg of the next 8 rows.

Then dec 1 st at each end of the next row and every foll alt row 9 times.

Work one row.

Cast off 20 sts.

Neckband

Join right shoulder seam.

With RS facing and US 10/6mm needles pick up and knit around neck edge as foll:

12 sts evenly down left front neck edge, 18 sts across center front from holder, 12 sts evenly up right front neck edge, 7 sts evenly down right back neck edge, 26 sts across center back from holder and 7 sts evenly up left back neck edge. 82 sts. Work as foll:

Row 1 (WS) P2, * K2, P2, rep from * to end.



32 Sweater

Row 2 K all K sts and P all P sts to end.
Rep the last 2 rows for a further 3 rows.
Row 7 (RS) K2, * P2, K2tog, yfrn, rep from * to the last 4 sts, P2, K2.
Row 8 P2, * K2, P2, rep from * to end.
Row 9 K2, * P2, yfrn, K2tog, rep from * to the last 4 sts, P2, K2.
Row 10 P2, * K2, P2, rep from * to end.
Rep rows 7 to 10 once more.
Rep rows 1 and 2 for 6 rows.
Cast off.

Finishing

Join left shoulder and neckband seams. Sew in sleeves by placing the center of the cast off row of sleeve to the shoulder edge and then sew sleeve to body down to underarm.

Sew up side and sleeve seams matching pattern. ■
